EV Charging Stations... One more time



Dahlia Moodie from the Bay Area Air Quality District and our technical consultant Timothy Stout toured the Village in February with Barbara Postel, Madeline Marrow, Michael Parker, Breana George, and Ron Kane.

Timothy decided that four car stalls (one for disabled drivers) in our corporation yard would be the best way to go. A similar plan was permitted in 2021 but the next board brought up liability concerns and rejected the plan. These chargers, for now, will only be available to AV members.

The stalls will be adjacent to our park on the south side of the maintenance yard. A fence and gate will keep the area separate. These will be level 2, 220-volt chargers, faster than a 120volt home version. A new grant will pay for all installation costs; all costs going forward will be paid by the users. No expense will fall on members not using the service. *Ritchie Cook*

Assessment Appeals Board Update

The board heard from our attorney on February 14 that the Assessment Appeals Board did not agree with our legal position and ruled that the Assessor may continue to assess our units as they always have.

Our attorney Tim Galusha said, "The fact that it took the board over a year to issue a decision suggests they gave the matter some serious consideration." The case was heard on December 2, 2021.

Based on this ruling, he also said we should submit information on sales of units. And our next step is to consider whether we want to accept the ruling and move on or appeal the decision with the court. Galusha cautioned the odds are less than 50/50 that we would prevail, so we need to decide whether to spend the funds on taking this to court.

Grants Update Richard J. Boyd Park

"Love Your Block," the Richmond city agency assisting us, plans to apply for a Clean California Local Grant, using the park master plan developed last year, but also holding another series of public input meetings. This grant is through Caltrans, and was designed in part to "Enhance, rehabilitate, restore, or install measures to beautify and improve public spaces and mitigate the urban heat island effect; enhance public health, cultural connection... by improving public spaces for walking and recreation; and advance equity for underserved communities." This makes it an excellent fit for the park. Grant deadline is April 1.

Plumbing: Efforts to identify the right grant are ongoing. Both the state "small community wastewater/drinking water" grants and the EPA are potential funding sources but require more research. Jacob Jernigan, Rep. John Garamendi staffer, has committed to examining ways their office can help. Note: Neither Richmond nor Contra Costa County are included in current Mills Act guidelines. Smaller grants available from the California Office of Historic Preservation may be an option. Sup. John Gioia has agreed to provide a letter of support, joining the ones already secured.

Scientific Presentation on Hydrogeology Study on Sunday, March 12

Atchison Village is a study site for a scientific project that will help us understand how rising sea levels and atmospheric river conditions will affect our buildings, landscape, underground infrastructure, and drainage as a shoreline community. Come hear PhD student **James Jacobs** share his AV data and analysis.

What's going on with our groundwater? Is it the same throughout the Village? How is this related to the type of soil in the Village? Is water in our crawlspaces due to groundwater flooding? What is the impact of rising sea level on groundwater? What can we learn from changes in groundwater during major rain events and king tides? Are there environmental contaminants present in our groundwater?
