The Affordable Connectivity

Program (**ACP**) is run by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to help low-income households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet. You are likely eligible if your household's income is below 200% of the Federal Poverty Line, or if you or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Price Lunch.

If your household is eligible, you could receive: Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service • Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands • A onetime discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50) • A low-cost service plan that may be fully covered through the ACP (see AffordableConnectivity.gov for details; or call 1-877-384-2575). For application: www.fcc.gov/acp.

Locked Out? Be Sure the Office has a Copy of Your Key



If you lock yourself out of your house during business hours, and **if you've given the office a copy of your key**, then

it will be loaned to you so that you can get back into your unit. If you are locked out of your house during nonbusiness hours, call the president or vice-pres and they can get your key from the office to let you back into your unit. The **iron gates** on West Bissell and West Chanslor Ave new padlocks. Ten members of Atchison Village living near the gates have keys to open the gates in an emergency. (The office has a list of these members; it's available upon request.)

If the Curry and Macdonald intersection is somehow blocked to traffic and a volunteer does not open the iron gates to allow you in and out of the Village, call the president or vice-pres to open the gates.

LOVE YOUR BLOCK

Did you know that studies show a link between trash and crime rates? It's true: picking up trash in areas with garbage on the streets directly reduces crime in those neighborhoods.

Many members have been picking up trash for years, and for the last couple of years a small group of volunteers has been collecting trash once a week around Atchison Village. We bought a trash can on wheels, some grabbers and trash bags, and most weeks we fill one or two 55-gallon bags with trash.

Recently, the City of Richmond gave us an in-kind **Love Your Block** grant (\$1000), which will provide us with the supplies that we have been buying ourselves!

In addition to making the Village safer and more appealing, working together is a great way to get to know your neighbors and to get out into the fresh air for an hour or two. - Join our existing Monday 3PM trash pick-up event
- Pick up trash with us once a week, and if so, when works for you
- Pick up trash regularly, but less often than once a week
- Join a Village-wide event once or twice a year to collect trash around AV

Grasses Dangerous to Dogs and Children

Foxtail grasses are growing everywhere this time of year. They have a sharp point and work their way into a dog's eye, ear, skin or digestive tract. The place they go in can become infected or the sharp point can work its way farther inside the dog. This is painful and dangerous for the dog and expensive to have a veterinarian remove it.



Dog owners need to brush the dog, check the skin, ears etc. and keep the dog away from long grass as much as possible. Children also can get the points in their skin or inhale the seeds. Home owners please keep foxtail grass cut short or even better pull it out of your lawn. Thank you! Jean Whittlesey


