Community Outreach and Bylaws Committee

Marcus Faumui, fire captain with the **Richmond Fire Department**, will attend the **Sept 13** regular board meeting to talk about the fire hazards of hoarding and blight. He will talk at the beginning of the meeting, followed by a short Q & A. The board is exploring city/Corporation partnerships to address fire and other hazards.

Then, on Wednesday, **Sept 20**, the board has invited **Charles Martin**, analyst for *Association Reserves*, to join us by Zoom to explain our reserve study and our funding. An open forum to discuss reserve funding and other issues members will follow. Members attending this meeting will receive a copy of the reserve study. A Spanish/English translator will be available.

Finally, on Wednesday, **Oct 18**, at 7 PM, our attorney, Jeffrey Allen, will return to explain his advice about wills and trusts. The **Bylaws Committee** will unveil a possible amendment to our bylaws to clarify the language about wills and trusts and to align our bylaws with present law. An open forum will follow to discuss wills, trusts, and tax appeal issues.

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#### Do you have an ant problem?

Many of us in AV are plagued with ants. Chris Baetge, our former office manager, recommended Terro ant bait when I initially moved in. I spent tons of money on it over the year, but it never completely eliminated the ants; it just kept them in one place.

Then another member recommended **Optigard** 

ant gel bait. This product really works! The ants swarm it and in a few hours they all disappear. You can



easily wipe up any remaining gel; it doesn't hurt any finish I put it on. You may have to do this several times, but after a few weeks, all my ants were gone. I have only seen it on Amazon (\$28.59). That's four tubes, which will last a long time.

Bob Buckingham lived in Atchison Village from 1942 to 1956. His father worked for the shipyard and Standard Oil. In July Bob visited our Member Forum and shared some personal photos from the 1940s. Bob tells of fun times as a teenager with friends from the Village and the broader neighborhood.
