# Community Outreach – Association Reserves Takeaways

Thank you to the 35 or so members who attended the Community Outreach Meeting in person on September 20 and the 15 who attended the meeting via Zoom. The sound was a little garbled, but I heard enough to gain some new understanding of the reserve study.

Charles Martin, the reserves analyst, listened to what members said, engaged in sincere conversations with them during the break, and came back unexpectedly to engage with our membership during the open forum portion of the meeting. During the discussion, we concluded that the information used to construct the reserve study was not complete and decided to supply Association Reserves, the company that will undertake our reserves study, with more specific information to make the reserve study more accurate.

Charles emailed our bookkeeper, Jay, immediately after the meeting and offered to rework the reserve study to meet our needs. This gives us the opportunity to work with our membership, and our staff to get it right; or at least get it "more right" than it was in the past.

Here are a few other takeaways:

- The purpose of funding our reserves is to prevent catastrophic "special assessments" in the future. Those large future special assessments, if they were to occur, would most hurt those living on fixed incomes.
- Funding reserves now is an attempt to minimize future risk. Charles said our level of reserve funding is a matter of how much risk we are willing to live with.
- The average reserve funding for associations and HOA's in California is 30%, not 100%. 70% funded is considered a safe level. It is perfectly responsible for Atchison Village to set

- an attainable target for funding and to work toward that goal incrementally.
- Reserve funding must be paired with accurate financial accounting. We need to correct the practice of mixing reserve and operational funds, and we need to further classify our reserve funds into replacement reserves (plumbing and electrical) and emergency reserves.

We will make the reserve study more specific to Atchison Village and we will keep you posted.

From the article "Unionists Buy Village in Richmond" in the *Contra Costa Labor Journal*, No.27, December 28, 1956:

"A group of union members has incorporated Atchison Village Mutual Homes Corporation and is taking over

public housing from the Richmond Housing Authority," according to George Mohr, publicity director for the corporation.

Fittingly, a member of Richmond's oldest local union, Carpenters 642, J.B. Wilson, is president, Vice President is W. L. Ward, member of Operating Engineers Local No. 3, and the Secretary is Florence Hill, member of Retail Clerks Local 1179. Fourteen other members of the Board of Directors are all reported union members also.".....

"Outstandingly active in getting the corporation going, Ward interested members of his own union and of other unions in the Atchison Village plan and in the possibility of working people combining in various ways to bring down the cost of housing."
