Something for Nothing?

Members have always encouraged the board to seek grants, donations, and other forms of outside support to fund capital improvement projects. I would like to report that the board will consider two such sources of funding and two such projects at the November board meeting: an electric vehicle (EV) charging station; and a security fence on West MacDonald in response to a petition from members.

State Funding for Electric Vehicle Charging

Starting in 2035 California will require all new vehicles sold in the state to be "zero emissions," which, for most of us, would mean an electric vehicle. Some members in AV are fortunate enough to have the back of their unit adjacent to a parking lot or have a driveway, but for 309 units, directing a cord from their unit to their vehicle's parking space is impossible. A new state-funded project of the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, in collaboration with Marin Clean Energy (MCE) and GRID Alternatives, will bring an EV charging infrastructure to communities throughout the region, including the Village.

The project will provide four level-2 charging stations in AV for all members to use. This opportunity is being coordinated by the Green Committee. The installation and equipment would be at no cost to Atchison Village or its members. Following are the amounts of the funding:

Labor, materials, and permits for building 4 charging stations and equipment: \$42,294 A new fence with a rolling gate: \$6,745 (still being negotiated)

Completion of the Security Fence on West MacDonald

In response to a petition signed by 17 members requesting a wrought iron

security fence to close two courtyards from West Macdonald pedestrian traffic, we will add an item to the November Board agenda to consider constructing such a fence.



Our biggest concern was that we did not want to commit ourselves to paying for a project that was not budgeted and which had no identified funding source.

Then a possible funding source appeared. One of the heirs of an auctioned unit donated his share of the proceeds back to the Corporation. This would be more than enough money to complete the security fence on West Macdonald. Extra money would be deposited into our reserve fund.

Labor and materials for completing the wrought iron fence on West Macdonald: \$28,875

If we approve both the above motions, it will provide the Corporation with \$77,914 worth of improvements at no cost to our members.

Our committee has been active this year. Connie Hibbard and Liam Caffrey have researched the long-sidelined window replacement project and have an action list.

Sandra Dugan and others are handling the rottedcorner project for several units. Daniel Leonard has been inspecting units and working on policy, among other

things.

Plumbing and electrical renovations of AV units are being held back to three per month, at an approximate cost of \$30,000. This is a multi-year project, and we've made real progress in the last 18 months.

Home inspections are required before a unit can be sold. This is an opportunity for AV Maintenance to update and perform repairs. At 80 years old, most units will need to upgrade their kitchen and bathroom electrical and plumbing. Along with AV work, it is an excellent time to update your apartment with new paint, cabinets, and flooring.

Please inform the office early if you plan to move so your work can be done as soon as possible. There is a waiting list.

Reminders

- Get a permit from the office before performing any work on your unit or yard. Do not just start hammering and sawing.
- Please report unauthorized work to the office. Work sometimes requires City permits, and for good reason.
- Notify the office if you have a maintenance issue. Please do not call the president with your concerns--he has plenty to do already. If you have discussed an issue with Daniel, Sandra, Connie, or Madeline, contact them directly.
- Should you be unhappy with an unresolved maintenance situation, you

may ask for a hearing before a majority of the board. The board will then discuss a resolution to your concern.

 All buildings and grounds remain property of Atchison Village and are not yours to do with as you will. You must ask before making changes.

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Hall Report

Madeline Marrow has taken on the Hall renovation with the help of Milly Frederick and Dan Leonard. Eclipse Acoustics will start installing acoustic tiles directly to the ceiling starting the week of Dec 5. This will solve two problems: cover the old ceiling and provide a surface that will absorb sound instead of bouncing it back. Eclipse says this will improve the acoustics by at least 50%. It will take a crew of four a week to complete the job.

After that the electrician will come in to install lights and fans. All the prep work for that will already have been completed. **We have a window for all this work to be done Dec 5 to Dec 12.**

All these renovations are funded by the Hall Account, rental funds that have been squirreled away for this purpose. No member funds are included in the work.

Water Conservation

Even though the severe drought is over, East Bay MUD still considers us to be in a low level of drought, and they anticipate the return of drought conditions in the years ahead. Their guidelines require water conservation, and AV requires members to abide by the EBMUD quidelines. Those guidelines include:

- Don't irrigate more than 3 times per week.
- Only irrigate before 9 am or after 5 pm
- No irrigation within 48 hours of measurable rainfall
- No irrigation that causes runoff (don't water the sidewalk!)
- No filling decorative fountains unless they recirculate water.
- Don't use water to wash sidewalks or driveways.
- Use a hose with a shutoff nozzle to wash your car.

If you can, consider replacing plants requiring a lot of water with native, drought-resistant plants.

You can help us save water and money: our water bill is paid by all of us.

History Corner from an unnamed newspaper, May 20, 1959 Protection for Village

Atchison Village will soon have "protection." A cannon made in 1867

by a Civil War veteran, J.J. Smith, will be donated to the village by its present owner, Patrick L. Haley, a retired Maritime Chief, of 229 Curry Street.

There have been only three owners of this cannon, which was used to salute Presidents McKinley, Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt and Wilson.

Haley, a member of the Rainbow Division in World War I, received the cannon from his commanding officer, Maj. R. Sackett, when Sackett died. The old weapon will be placed by the flagpole of the Atchison Village administration building.
