Now, for the Hard Part

In December the Board approved a budget with a slight surplus created by cutting expenses. Now comes the hard part. We are researching cost increases that will affect our 2024 budget. We will vote on these increases in front of the members at the January 10 board meeting. Because our budget is balanced, those increases will probably need to be funded by dues increases. Following are the budget items that will result in increased costs. Our bookkeeper will calculate the dollar amount for the items below, and it will be included in the January agenda for you to review before the meeting.

• Motion to add a 2.8% inflation adjustment for operational costs.

• Motion to extend the bookkeeper's duties to include part-time business/project manager activities for a six-month trial period.

- Motion to budget for a CPA to review financial reconciliations monthly rather than quarterly.
- Motion to fund the 3.2% salary increase guaranteed by our employee contract.
- Motion to fund the projected increase in garbage costs.
- Motion to add \$15 + CPI every year to our monthly dues to be deposited exclusively into our reserve account until it is 100% funded.

One of the most ominous financial news this year is that our insurance company will no longer offer liability insurance to common-interest developments in California. We will lose our liability insurance. Our insurance broker will try to find. another policy. Our observation has been that as insurance companies stop doing business in California, those that remain raise their rates. We now pay \$223,000 per year (\$42/month per member!) and we will not know if and how much that will change until February 14.

Holiday Tree Disposal and Recycling Options



Residents have several options to properly dispose of holiday trees. Please read the flver

below for how to dispose of holiday trees. For additional information call, Republic Services at 510-262-7100.

1. Curbside Collection

On any of your regular organic waste collection days, cut your natural, unflocked Christmas tree to fit in your organic waste cart. Trees must be 6 feet or less in diameter and cut into 3foot lengths. Remove stand and all decorations. Artificial, flocked and ornament-contaminated trees are not compostable. Cut or trim to fit in the brown or black trash cart and set out on any regular trash collection day.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR COMPOSTING HOLIDAY TREES!

➤ Remove all lights, ornaments, tinsel, nails and stands.

 No flocked, painted, fireproof or artificial trees or trees contaminated with decorations, stands or plastic/cloth wrappings.
If trees are more than 6 feet tall, please cut in half.

2. Self-haul (Drop-off)

With proof of residency (driver's license or CA ID), Republic Services customers can take trees to Golden Bear Transfer (#1 Parr Blvd., Richmond, Monday - Friday, 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. and Saturday - Sunday, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.) through the first weekend in February at no cost for compostable trees. There is a disposal fee for non-compostable trees or no proof of residency (approximately \$12.15 - subject to change).
