Unit to be Auctioned: Unit 304, a one-bedroom unit next to the liquor store on West Bissell, has been listed for auction since March 25. Minimum bid is \$100,000. Members will receive a flyer with the April agenda. Closing date is <u>May 8 at 4:30</u> <u>PM</u> before the board meeting.

Health and Safety Inspections: As we resolve our three crises-plumbing, financial and insurance—we can address buildings and units that have rat and pest problems that got out of control during covid. We are initiating health and safety inspections in the units that harbor these conditions. We will require members to correct those conditions. AV is replacing windows, smoke alarms, and repairing plumbing and electrical problems at the same time. Then, we will contract with a business that specializes in "rat proofing" buildings by performing specialized rodent inspection, sealing any holes in unit walls and areas where pipes come into the unit, closing any openings to the exterior of the buildings, and setting traps for any rats that remain. As we improve procedures, encourage member cooperation, and perform inspections, we can expand inspections in the future into routine operations as required by our bylaws. Madeline Marrow

Hall Report

All renovations to the Hall were paid entirely by rental fees. If you did not rent the space, you did not pay for the renovation.

Hall rental fees can only be used to maintain the Hall. The fees are deposited into the Hall account, which is in the AV credit union. All vendors and materials used for the renovation were paid from that account.

Before the renovation the dropped ceiling was disintegrating. According to Ardie Smith, a charter member, the ceiling was installed shortly after the corporation was formed, more than 60 years ago. Several of the florescent bulbs were burned out and no longer being manufactured. The floor was in dire need of refinishing and the walls were full of cracks and holes.

The members who rent the Hall celebrate important family events—weddings, *quinceañeras*, birthdays, anniversaries, graduations. They deserve a classy venue.

CalFresh Benefits go Further at Mobile Farm Trucks



If you receive CalFresh benefits (formerly EBT), you can

double your benefits at the *Fresh Approach* mobile farm trucks. In addition to CalFresh, *Fresh Approach* also offers a 50% discount on produce every week for participants in WIC, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Supplemental Security Disability Income (SSDI), Medi-Cal, and Medicaid. You are also eligible if you are low income, unemployed or have a membership at a food pantry.

Locally, the Fresh Approach Mobile Farm Truck comes to **Richmond** and **San Pablo** on **Wednesdays**. Find the truck in front of the Richmond Public Library (Nevin Ave. and Civic Center Plaza) from 10 AM–11:30 AM, and at the San Pablo Senior Center (1943 Church Lane), 12 PM–1:30 PM.

Local farmers' markets also participate in the CalFresh Market Match program; most offer between \$5 and \$10 in free produce per day. The Richmond Farmers' Market is open every Friday from 7 AM-5 PM at 24th St and Barrett Ave across from the Richmond Art Center.

Tree-fense is a mixture of trees and shrubs planted in dense patterns to buffer pedestrians, cyclists, and residents from nearby road air pollution and traffic noise. The Richmond Parkway Tree-Fense project aims to reduce the effects of pollution from adjacent industries and vehicles in nearby neighborhoods like Atchison Village and the Iron Triangle.

Green Team

Groundwork Richmond's Green team is a summer youth program that offers outdoor activities and opportunities to Richmond youth ages 13 to 18. The program takes kids on camping, hiking, kayaking, canvassing, tree planting, even educational training and trips. This is also a paid opportunity.
